

- Held news conference in October to announce project



- Held grand opening on February 22

How to Become a Seed Library Member

The Duluth Seed Library is located on the top floor of the Main Library in downtown. Simply fill out a membership form, and choose up to 4 packets of seeds to take home. Grow them in your garden this summer, and return seeds harvested from your healthy adult plants!

Goals of the Duluth Seed Library

1. Instill the important principle of public ownership of seed and plant materials

2. Provide a public source of seeds for all citizens of Duluth so they may grow their own healthy food

3. Increase knowledge of gardening and home horticulture

4. Increase consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables

5. Enhance the social capital of Duluth by engaging community members in a positive activity

6. Contribute to developing a regionally-adapted seed stock


Seed offered for sale in containers or in bulk for sowing purposes in Minnesota must have attached a seed label containing the information required by the Minnesota Seed Law in Minnesota Statutes, section 21.82.
